Last December, Home Sweet Home Ministries developed a new way for families experiencing homelessness to provide gifts for their children at Christmas. With your support, we look forward to inspiring that sense of independence and hope once more.

“Our goal was to avoid just giving out items. We created a concept where we empowered parents with the opportunity to do something for themselves to earn points to shop for gifts for their children,” explains Steve Tassio, HSHM’s Director of Community Outreach.

Participating parents could earn points by completing various tasks at Home Sweet Home including cleaning, washing dishes, or sorting items at the co-op. For every hour worked, they would receive 10 points, with the option to accumulate up to 200 points. Parents could then exchange those points to shop for gifts.

“It was very successful,” adds Steve. “We had 20 parents in total from the shelter, co-op, and Milestones participate.”

Volunteers from Eastview Christian Church helped transform The Junction into a winter wonderland. Beautiful decorations glimmered from every corner. Tables were overflowing with a variety of toys and games ranging from 2 to 20 points. Parents could even indulge in a comforting cup of cocoa at the hot chocolate bar.

Amid battling serious health issues and homelessness, Brady decided it was time for a change. Last October, Brady reached out to Home Sweet Home for support. HSHM staff surrounded him in comfort and prayer. He gained confidence as staff and other residents kept speaking hope into him.

After lots of time to recover and heal, Brady was finally able to seek employment again. He got a job and started saving every penny he could. He continues to work, keeps on his finances, and is even seeing his family again. “Home Sweet Home Ministries truly cared for me. They helped me gain my life back.”




# Help Support Give Thanks


With your support, Home Sweet Home provides safety and comfort to families seeking a fresh start. We appreciate your help in collecting the following items:
