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Bread for Life Food Co-op Builds Community

Two years ago, Home Sweet Home Ministries opened the Bread for Life Food Co-op. The co-op currently has over 400 active members and over 5,000 hours of service completed. In a typical month co-op members make 400 shopping trips to select the foods for themselves and their families. Obtaining food security is important, but equally important is the sense of community that has developed among its members.

CarolAnn Carara, HSHM's Director of Hospitality Services, says "It has been amazing over the past two years to see people building trusting, dependable relationships by being co-op members. Those relationships enhance their faithfulness and the productivity of the co-op. If they know their friend is going to be there, they are going to come."

"We've watched so many members grow in their feelings of self-worth and dignity, and we've seen members grow in their skills" CarolAnn continues,

"Instead of coming in to receive something, co-op members get to work alongside people who are going through similar life situations.

It isn't just about the food- that almost becomes a by-product. It's about the people."

"A good example of this would be Carla. When Carla signed up for the Co-op, on her membership application there is a space for employment and Carla wrote, "disabled cannot do anything". Carla used a walker to get around. But we worked with Carla to figure out what would work for her. Today Carla still uses her walker, although she stands much more erect and even has a little spring in her step. Carla has made new relationships and finds some much needed community while she works in the co-op. Carla is not just a name and a face. She is a friend and co-worker within the co-op."

So far this year, we have had over 14,800 volunteer hours.

The children who reside at Home Sweet Home are also "in training." They are learning that Jesus loves them. They have opportunities to participate in worship and Bible study. They are learning to apply the Golden Rule.

I thank God for parents, teachers, youth leaders, mentors and the children and youth they influence. Please join me in praying for all children and youth and the adults who are involved in their lives.

and that I'm valued. Being a part of the Bread for Life Co-op has made me aware of the struggles that everyone is going through. No matter how bad my problems seem to be, so many other people here are struggling with something worse. It humbles me and makes me so thankful for everything I've been blessed with. I'm so grateful every day. For me, the Bread for Life Co-op is more than just food. It's the people that continue to bring me back. I've built relationships with so many people, and have found true, dependable friendships. The food has become secondary. I don't come back for the food, I come back for the support I get from everyone."
