Inspiring New Directions

Home Sweet Home Ministries strives to use innovative approaches to help those in need in our community. We are pleased to announce the start of a new initiative, Rapid Rehousing, in addition to our expansion of Bridge of Hope.

"Rapid Rehousing is all about helping people get into a home of their own as fast as possible and then providing them with support once they are in that home," explains HSHM Chief **Operating Officer Matt** Burgess.

The faster housing is established, the more time a participant has to focus on the restoration of their life. "When people are provided access to housing, a lot of the associated problems they're experiencing start to improve," shares Burgess. "For example, if somebody is struggling with their

mental health and they're homeless, if they are provided a home, their mental health starts to improve. The need for safety and security is a fundamental need. Providing someone with a home of their own immediately provides that safe zone."

Participants will work closely with Home Sweet Home's Rapid Rehousing Navigator to move in to a place of their own in a matter of days.

> HSHM will provide time and quantity limited rental assistance. Burgess adds,

> > "We look forward to

developing significant relationships with landlords. We plan on reaching out to landlords large and small."

Once housing is secured, participants must find ways to stabilize their income through employment or benefits to maintain housing.

Home Sweet Home hopes to help 15 households within the first year with this new initiative.

Another exciting way HSHM will be preventing homelessness in our community is through the expansion of Bridge of Hope. Home Sweet Home has utilized the program for the past five years.

"The goal is to help families over a course of 18-24 months build friendships and a support system that lasts." With limited resources, the program has only impacted a couple of families at a time.

"We are blessed to have a full-time Bridge of Hope Family Resource Coordinator now on staff," announces Newbill. "Having someone devoted to developing neighboring groups, landlord relationships, and working with families is an amazing opportunity for us."

Home Sweet Home looks forward to impacting up to four families within the first year. We are thrilled to embark on this new journey to instill hope, restore lives, and build community.
