# Night in a car

**Cold. Restricted. Revealing. Meaningful.** These are just a few of the words participants used to describe sleeping in their cars on February 1st as part of Home Sweet Home Ministries' Night In A Car at Trinity Lutheran Church in Bloomington.

150 participants comprised of individuals, families, churches, and businesses including Keller Williams Realty, Connect Transit, and Integrity Technology Solutions, all experienced a unique glimpse into homelessness. First time participant Kimberly Kernosky shares, "I couldn't stop thinking about the people that do this every day and still have to get up and take their kids to school. How does that really work for them? It was very eye opening."

"You think about things like privacy and space and how do you get ready for the next day," adds Tony Gilmer, a HSHM board member and first time participant. "Where do you shower if you have to get up and go to work? It's really interesting."

"I didn't realize how lonely I would be in the car," expresses Keith Cornille, President of Heartland Community College. "I could easily see how that could just evolve into depression."

After spending more than eight hours in their cars, participants drove away with a new outlook on the struggles that others deal with on a nightly basis.

"I think it really opened my eyes that we are all potentially one missed paycheck away from being in this situation," states Tony. "It helped me realize that it is not a choice for a lot of people. It becomes their way of life."

"There are people right here in Bloomington-Normal that are doing what we just did," shares Pastor Brian Fatheree of Victory Church. "I recently spoke with someone who had just found their own place after living in their car for about two years. So I know that we're making an impact."

The greater Bloomington-Normal community continues to support this unique event, raising over \$90,000 for our shelter and outreach programs. Your participation will continue to grow this event to drive out homelessness in 2020. Mark your calendars for Friday, February 7, 2020. Thank you!

Home Sweet Home Ministries' Women's Auxiliary is a proud supporter of Night In A Car 2019.



"Having the opportunity to get involved with something that's local is very rewarding," says Nolan Recker, Vale Church Guest Services Pastor.

Vale Church has actively supported HSHM over the past five years. At the end of February, 11 Vale staff members volunteered to prepare and serve three meals in our dining center.

"I got to come out here and make baked ziti," shares Nolan. "I usually don't make a lot of pasta, but it's been good."
