

Your donations, time, and efforts blessed over 4,000 people with food, friendship, and a fresh start.

Dear Friends,

What's new at Home Sweet Home Ministries? Our core mission remains constant, but the way in which we accomplish the mission requires innovative approaches. Some of our innovative approaches in 2019 included:

- Less Expansion of the Rapid Rehousing program. Our Rapid Rehousing Navigator works with individuals in need of sustainable housing and landlords to address obstacles that stand in the way of securing housing. 23 individuals received housing through this program in 2019.
- 2. Expansion of Bridge of Hope. The Bridge of Hope program pairs an individual or family in need of housing with a group of Neighboring Volunteers from a local faith community to form a support network.
- ③. Growth of Night in a Car. 150 participants raised awareness of hidden homelessness in our community and raised \$90,000 to support our services to individuals experiencing homelessness.
- 4. Mission Mart adopted an improved POS system and has enhanced operational efficiency by having items priced and tagged at our warehouse.
- 5. We are now outsourcing many of our personnel needs, resulting in lower recruiting costs and lower turnover.
- 6. Our Bread for Life Food Co-op redesigned vouchers and co-op applications, started processing some foods, and celebrated the co-op's five-year anniversary.
- 7. Growth of community collaboration through Big Give. 18 churches, 115 Thrivent Action Teams, and \$28,750 from Thrivent Financial made it possible for us to provide Thanksgiving meals to 2,400 local households.
- **8.** Our Board of Directors formed an Endowment Committee to provide oversight to an endowment fund that was established in response to a bequest.

A focus area of our mission statement for 2020 is on demonstrating Christ's love. Our employees and volunteers strive to share the love of Christ in all that they do every day. You, as our friends and supporters, do that as well through your prayers and gifts. Thank you for making it all possible.
