Anticipation is building as Home Sweet Home Ministries prepares for our 5th annual Night In A Car. Nearly 200 Participants are busy packing up hats, gloves, blankets, and more to brave a cold night in their cars on Friday, February 5th.

The event serves as a unique experience for all ages. Several families, organizations, businesses, and even HSHM staff have volunteered to spend the night in their cars from their own driveways or in Trinity Lutheran Church's parking lot. While only for one night, Night In A Car provides a real glimpse into the realities of facing homelessness through Bloomington's harsh winters.

Cassie Little and several of her sorority sisters from Illinois State University's Epsilon Sigma Alpha chapter have taken on the challenge. The sorority has a total of 10 teams participating.

"I'm participating in Night In A Car because I don't think there is enough awareness about how hard it is to get back on your feet after you've been exposed to homelessness," says Cassie.

This will be Epsilon Sigma Alpha's third year of being involved. They are excited to spread hope for those in need.

"Personally when I was younger and in elementary school, I did have to live out of my car for several weeks," adds Cassie. "It was a really challenging experience, but it made me stronger."

Home Sweet Home encourages you to join others like Cassie. Together we can achieve reaching our goal of raising \$100,000 to support those in need.

"I think our community should be coming together to help people in those situations," says Cassie. "I don't ever want anyone to feel like because they are down on their luck that they don't have someone they can reach out to for help. 
