Back in June, many in our community experienced flooding due to heavy downpours. As water rushed through Home Sweet Home Ministries' doors, 38 inches of accumulated rainwater flooded our entire basement. Equipment, tools, a surplus of food donations—all gone.

"Everything in our freezers was a total loss. It was heartbreaking to dispose of so much food," says Carol Schrenk, HSHM's Food Services Manager.

When Home Sweet Home put out a plea for help, we were quickly surrounded in love. Monetary donations rushed in from the community, including \$20,000 from State Farm, \$5,000 from the Illinois Farm Bureau and Growmark, and another \$5,000 from Bridgestone. Several local businesses came to our aid to provide clean up and maintenance assistance. Seven local restaurants stepped up to provide meals and Chestnut Health Systems donated freezers. Midwest Food Bank in addition to churches like First Presbyterian Church, helped to replenish our immediate food needs, plus many others.

"Because of your love and prayers, our residents remained unaffected. We continued to offer safe shelter, meals, and counseling. We truly value knowing that you care about the work we do. Thank you for uplifting our hearts," exclaims Matt Burgess, HSHM's CEO.

It took 68 fans and 22 dehumidifiers to dry out the basement. The restoration company even had to remove the bottom 4 feet of drywall throughout the basement. In total, we filled 7 roll-off dumpsters full of damaged items.

After the final cleaning and sanitization in mid-July, we were finally ready to begin rebuilding. Home Sweet Home had a portion of the basement floor resealed in the food storage area. Volunteer construction crews have installed new walls in our maintenance shop and in the surrounding spaces.
