

Dear Friends,

As I look back on all that was 2021, I marvel at the steadfastness of Home Sweet Home Ministries and all of you who support our ministry. As the Covid-19 pandemic continued its grip on our world, we nonetheless kept offering opportunities and support to our neighbors when they needed it most.

In May, we joyfully celebrated the grand re-opening of the Bread For Life food co-op in its new home in our building at 301 E Oakland Ave. The new and improved space provides a more accessible and welcoming environment for our co-op members who are working to achieve food security for themselves and their families. It also added enhanced food processing capacity so that we can make the most of all the food donations we receive, regardless of its shape or size.

In June, we survived historic storms that hit McLean County and resulted in 38 inches of accumulated flood waters in the basement of our shelter building. The resulting losses and damage approached \$300,000 but thanks to the generosity and response of our community, HSHM was able to minimize the impact on those we serve – and we never had to shut down our shelter operations during our recovery.

We also identified and began focusing on our "core values" of Faith, Grace, Relationships, and Resourcefulness. These values have become integral in how we approach the work we do each day. We continue to develop our supervisory and administrative processes with these as the central focus.

As you review the facts and figures in this annual report, I pray that you keep in mind each individual those numbers represent. Honoring God through our service to our neighbors is what matters most, and remembering that each person we serve is a unique reflection of God in our community is what keeps us centered on that which is truly important - to "Demonstrate Christ's love through innovative approaches that instill hope, restore lives, and build community."



In 2021, there were <u>12,422</u> nights of shelter provided to a grand total of 324 men, women, and children of our community.

A MOVE, A FLOOD, A COVID OUTBREAK, AND A NEW MINISTRY!

Did all of that <u>really</u> happen in 2021?!

I couldn't believe it when I thought back to all that we

did at Home Sweet Home Ministries last year.



January through May of 2021 found us remodeling 301 E. Oakland to fit the needs of our growing Bread for Life Co-op. The big move from the basement of the shelter to the new home for the co-op was finished just in time for the ribbon cutting we held in May. That location has proven to be an incredible space, making it much easier for members to access as well as giving the co-op an even more sleek 'store-like' design. I still smile every time I walk in the door and see the shelves full of food and members, volunteers, and staff enjoying their times of organizing and shopping.

As the COVID-19 pandemic persisted much longer than any of us anticipated, Home Sweet Home Sweet Home Ministries' Client Services department continued to be diligent about helping the residents, staff, and volunteers to remember to mask. At times we had to suspend volunteers in the building because of COVID. We would then see the COVID numbers going down and bring back the volunteers.....only to see them increase again and pause our volunteer involvement. It was quite the roller coaster!

We were able to keep the COVID monster at bay until the end of December and early January when it hit us hard. Because of the dedication and flexibility of our staff, we were able to care for our residents and get through that outbreak. At one time, our positivity rate in the shelter was 75%.

Good news prevailed as 2021 brought vital conversations with shelter residents, low income non-residents, and many other social services in the community to determine how we might best serve the Bloomington/Normal area. We were researching how we could best use the half of 301 E. Oakland not housing the Bread for Life Co-Op. The outcome of many conversations led us to develop plans to transform that space into a community center in which people could come together to relax and enjoy the company of friends as well as receive needed resources. The name of this new ministry, The Junction, is the perfect description of what we hope to happen there: where people find the intersection of where they've come from and where they might want to go in their lives.

This year proved challenging, but thanks to the community's loving support and encouragement, Home Sweet Home remains strong. Together we were able to provide 324 men, women, and children with new opportunities to rebuild their lives.


