A LETTER FROM CEO, MATT BURGESS

Dear Friends,

I hope that the 2023 Annual Report shows you some of the ways our ministry continues to serve Bloomington-Normal and the surrounding area, seeking to “Demonstrate Christ’s love through innovative approaches that instill hope, restore lives, and build community.” The successes and challenges of the past year will be familiar to many of you who’ve supported Home Sweet Home Ministries so faithfully over time.

The historically challenging housing market I noted in last year’s report continues to significantly impact the work we do in trying to support our neighbors’ journey back into living independently. While our shelter remains full at all times now, we continue to see success in helping people get housed. In addition to providing access to affordable housing directly through our ownership of a duplex we have begun entering into “master lease” agreements with local landlords. We are excited about the early success of this approach and are actively making plans to expand this approach.

2023 also brought a lot of growth and new learning experiences for the HSHM team. The Junction continues to be a highly utilized space where people and services connect with one another.

Thanksgiving at HSHM was once again marked by a massive turkey distribution and Thanksgiving Day meal delivery to the community – this year almost 2000 turkeys and over 450 fully-cooked meals were provided to community members who would otherwise not have been able to celebrate the holiday.

Our Client Services team is participating in a Medical Respite planning project, discovering what this type of service includes and what resources it would take to start offering this support in Bloomington-Normal.

On a final note, this fall HSHM began responding to the urgent crisis of the large tent encampment adjacent to our campus. Through active partnership with Eastview Christian Church (the owners of the parking lot), the City of Bloomington, and many caring people in the community we are doing everything possible to ensure the safety, health, and well-being of our camping neighbors as well as our neighbors in the surrounding area. While we are already providing many immediate supports to the residents of the encampment, we’re also working hard to pursue long-term, more sustainable strategies to provide a safe place for them to seek shelter beyond trying to survive in a tent. I hope to be able to provide a recap of these efforts by the time we produce our Annual Report next year. Stay tuned! As you review the data in this annual report, I pray that you remember that all of our data points to the lives of those we serve, each man, woman, and child who comes to us for help in whatever circumstances they find themselves. Thank you for the ongoing support of our work – when you support Home Sweet Home Ministries you are really supporting the people we serve. All we do is done in partnership with you!




BREAD FOR LIFE FOOD CO-OP





